In response to the Governor's Executive Order that provides relief from certain tax deadlines, New Milford's Town Council voted on April 13th to approve a 90 day deferral on tax bills that will become due July 1, 2020. Instead of having to pay by August 1, 2020 without interest, taxpayers will have until October 1, 2020 to pay without interest. On October 2, 2020 any current bills unpaid will be subject to 6% interest (1.5% interest per month from July-October).

- Per the State of Connecticut Taxpayers whose taxes are escrowed and paid by a mortgage company or bank are not eligible for the extended grace period.
- No application is necessary for taxpayers if you are not a landlord and you do not have an escrow account – no further action is required.
- If you are a landlord, the State of Connecticut asks you to complete the fillable form that can be found on the Tax Collector's home page and return it to the tax collector's office with supporting documentation on or before July 1st:
